### FREE PARVO VIRUS VACCINES

**What:** Santa Ana Police Animal Services reports that there has been a large influx of Parvo infected dogs at veterinary offices and at the shelter. Parvo is a viral disease that attacks the lining of the digestive system of dogs. Pet owners, especially those with puppies, should have their dogs vaccinated to prevent the spread of infection. Puppies usually do not survive Parvo. However, those pets that do survive generally incur large vet bills.

A large number of Parvo virus cases continue to be reported in Santa Ana. In an effort to help minimize the spread of this virus, 17th St. Animal Hospital will be offering a vaccination clinic for puppies living within Santa Ana. The puppy Parvo vaccine will be **FREE** to Santa Ana residents.
